I write in order to bring forth the voices of women, and to help them be fully heard and honestly understood. For me, writing literature is an opportunity to examine and illuminate the myriad issues that women face in their lives. Every author hopes to have their contribution recognized as significant. This Nautilus award is a true confirmation that I need to keep writing!"

The Passion of Marta was also short-listed for the 2017 Chanticleer Goethe Award for Historical Fiction post-1750.

About the Author: Caren Umbarger attended Bennington College, earned a BA in violin performance from Hamline University, and has been a professional musician and string teacher for more than thirty-five years. Caren grew up in Mason City, Iowa; taught, performed and conducted in Minneapolis for three decades; moved to Florida in 2010 and served as artistic director of the Flagler Youth Orchestra for three years.
